4-4-07 I, Marica Coana, was reviewing my e-mails received one from Sylvia Schmit Mrs Gethings daughter regarding her medication. She basically wants to change Haloperidol and according to her letter she spoke to plans at Dr Paul Liv. I discussed with our facility administrator regarding the letter, and she stated that she also received this letter and that she was going to call her and Dr Paul Liv to discuss it to inform them that we cannot follow up with verbal orders from family members that this have to come written down from the doctor orders. Gladys called Sylvia - a nurse with her and also called doctor Paul Liv while it was with her in her office. Dr Paul Liv stated to Gladys that he was going to discuss with Sylvia about Haldol & that he first needed to discuss with his psychiatric. That according to Sylvia resident was having changes apparently she thinks she is sedated. Gladys told Dr Liv that Mrs Gethings seems stable she is calm and spending more time in activities and that she was stable at night, no more hallucinations + paranoia so Dr Paul Liv stated that then to dis regard order that he talked to discontinue Haldol injection and oral and to do Haldol 3x PRN. Which it was discussed with him by Gladys that we cannot give PRN orders unless he wants to be call so he stated he was going to discuss again with Sylvia and with psychiatric because Sylvia basically was telling him that she wanted all this done then he made this changes. then second Fax 4/4/07 to discontinue Haldol injection and oral med. for now to do this and he will discuss with daughter that he cannot really please her and that

Dear Maria and Dr. Liu,

I just spoke with my mother's psychiatrist, Dr. Yegiazaryan who has some concerns about the potentially very serious side effects that can occur with one of the medications my mother is currently taking; Haloperidol. In order to try and minimize any potential side effects and because my mother's condition has stabilized, Dr Yegiazaryan has recommended that we make the following changes to my mother's medication schedule:

- 1.) Put the upcoming injection of Halopendol (which I believe is scheduled for next week) "on hold" and only do it if and when my mother becomes uncooperative or agitated. (This means we have to monitor my mother very closely for any changes in her behavior. If my mother shows any signs of reverting back to her former condition, we will have to resume with injecting the Halopendol.)
- 2.) Reduce the Haloperidol (1 milligram dose in tablet form) that is currently being given her on a daily basis to ½ milligram dose in tablet form to be given to her on an "as needed" basis and NOT every night. (Once again, this will require that she is monitored very closely.)
- 3.) Continue giving my mother the other medications as listed on her medication record. (Including the "Paxel" patch that I did not see on the record. Do either of you know why it is not listed?)

Dr. Liu, based on my conversation with Chris Liu today, I am assuming that you will be agreeable to these changes. Of course, as my mother's primary care physician, I defer to your judgment and call and respectfully ask for your permission to make these changes.

Mana, it is very important that we monitor my mother very closely for any changes in her behavior so that we can adjust her treatment accordingly. If my mother reverts back to her prior state, we may have to resume with injecting the Halopendol. I hope that will not be the case. If there is a problem or you have any questions and/or you need to get something in writing from Dr. Yegiazaryan before you can make these changes, please give her a call at (818) 500-9709.

Mana, Dr. Liu, at your convenience, please call me to discuss, if there are any questions and/or there is a problem. Or, please fax to me a revised medication record that reflects these changes, so that I know that the appropriate changes have been made to my mother's medication record.

I thank you in advance for your cooperation and assistance.
